

# Why teach?

- Making a difference
- Make an impact
  - To help young people and to help them develop skills.
- Share my subject passion
  - I love bringing real life science stories into the classroom so students can build knowledge of the world around them





### Numbers to know

- £15K-29K funding available for training (scholarship & bursaries)
- £30K- minimum starting salary
- 2 Years- early career teachers

### Steps to becoming a teacher

#### 1. Decide who to teach

#### a. How?


- a. Get school experience or
- b. Attend events (like this one)- to see which settings suits you.
- c. Primary (ages 5-11)
- d. Secondary (ages 11 18)
- e. Early years (children up to age of 5)
- f. Further education (teaching at Colleges or Sixth Form Colleges)
- g. A-F = → applicable to teaching in primary, secondary and teaching disable pupils or pupils with special educational needs (in main stream schools).

# Steps to becoming a teacher

- Paid internship → for students who are interested in a career in teaching
- Get paid £300/week (<u>Teaching internships | Get Into</u>
  <u>Teaching GOV.UK (education.gov.uk)</u>
- Internship subjects (chemistry, computing, languages, maths, physics)

- 3. Check your qualifications (What qualifications do you need to train?)
  - GCSEs at grade 4 (C) or above in English and maths (and science if you want to teach primary)
  - a bachelor's degree
  - No Bachelors? → train to be a teacher as part of your Bachelor's degree and get a QTS.

### Steps to becoming a teacher

- Educationqualifications
  - Bed
  - PGD
  - NCE

# In the UK

- No experience/fresh into teaching
  - TT Training/Education Network Training- more on this later.

### QTS

- QTS legal requirement to teach in maintained primary, secondary and special schools in England (schools funded by local authorities).
- ii. Degree courses that include QTS typically cost £9,250 per year and can take up to 4 years but you can get funding for your training.
- iii. Qualifications vary depending on the course; eg
  - Bachelor of Arts (BA)
  - Bachelor of Education (BEd)
  - Bachelor of Science (BSc)

- QTS From Outside the UK- How?
  - Through TT- primary or secondary
  - Through a PGCE TT course
  - Assessment only programme
  - For oversea trained teachers

### **Routes to QTS**

- There are 4 routes to QTS for teachers and trainees outside the UK:
  - 1. Apply online service
  - 2. Apply for assessment only QTS
  - 3. Apply for teacher training in England
  - Apply to train for international qualified teacher status (iQTS)

- Your eligibility for each route will depend on:
  - Where you qualified
  - Your subject specialism
  - Whether you already have teaching experience
  - Your personal circumstances

- Apply to train for international qualified teacher status ( iQTS)
  - A new teaching qualification backed by the UK government.
  - iQTS meets the same high standards as
  - Leads to the automatic award of QTS.
  - You can train where you live and work, with no need to visit the UK.

- Check your eligibility to apply for QTS in England
  - Apply for QTS in Englandeducation.gov.uk
  - 1st step lesson observation in school.
  - PGCE route
  - TT Education Network
